INTO THE WILD

Nothing beats a first-time experience, except reliving it through the eyes of your children. Watch as they marvel at a mighty lion, or witness their face light up at the sight of a firefly. Big and small, there is so much to see, and our experienced guides won't let the little details pass you by on a game drive. Children can get close to the ground on walking safaris, or take to the water for a different perspective. They can fish for bream in the Chongwe River, or try their hand at tiger fishing in the Zambezi River. For the ultimate return to the wild, children over 12 can join you on our Sleepout under the Stars, where they will fall asleep under a canopy of a million twinkling stars, listening to the susurrations of the nighttime bush.

INTO THE WILD

In the interests of safety, participation of children in game activities is at the discretion of their guide and the minimum age inside National Parks for walking safaris and sleepouts is 12 years. Families of four or fewer members, including at least 1 child younger than 8 years, are required to book and pay for the use of a private game viewer for the duration of their stay. Adults are responsible for supervising children at all times.

BACK IN CAMP

Children under 12 can also learn the art of tracking with our guides on the paths between the rooms. They can mold and take home a animal track with them as a memory from their safari. Children can also choose where to set up a camera trap to see which animals came to visit overnight. Children can help our chefs make muffins for their morning game drive, cookies or cake for their afternoon tea, or smores on the fire for dessert after dinner. They can even learn how to bake bread in a traditional bush oven outdoors. Our team love to share their passion and knowledge of the various elements of a safari lodge with young, aspiring minds.

ARTS + CRAFTS

Children can craft their own souvenir to take home as a special reminder of their family safari. They are encouraged to collect natural materials with their guide and bring them back to camp to create their own natural paint brushes using sticks, feathers, leaves and grasses. They will also collect sand from the dry riverbank for a unique sand art activity in camp between drives. If time in their itinerary allows, kids can visit Tribal Textiles in South Luangwa for an art safari, or Mulberry Mongoose to create a custom piece of jewellery with local craftswomen, who use only natural materials and snare wire recovered from poaching traps. Mulberry Mongoose beading kits are also available in camp.
